Music at Stowe





Opened in 2014, the Chung Music School includes the 200 seat Ugland Auditorium, two ICT suites running Logic Pro X and Sibelius 7 software (enhanced by Native Instruments Komplete plug-ins), a soundproofed Pro-Tools-equipped recording studio with tie lines to all other major spaces in the building, a well-resourced Music Library, and numerous practice and rehearsal rooms. Stowe is an All-Steinway School featuring Steinways and Steinway-designed pianos (Boston and Essex models) in all teaching and practice rooms, including a piano teaching studio containing two Steinway Baby Grands, and a Model D Grand in the Recital Room.

The Music Department holds regular events and masterclasses for pupils given by world-class musicians including Atsuko Kawakami, Joanna MacGregor, Darius Brubeck and Ryan Carey-Hills, and has close relationships with a number of highprofile artists such as Lang Lang who, during his visit in April 2015, was made Lifetime President of the Chung Music School. <image>

There are around ninety musical events in the School year and it is not unusual for there to be several in any one week. There are regular concerts given by the pupils, often during one of the School lunchtimes. Major concerts take place throughout the year given by the Orchestra, Chapel Choir, Wind Band, Choral Society or other large ensembles. In recent years, the Choral Society has performed Haydn's Nelson Mass, the Mozart and Fauré Requiems, and Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. There is also an annual House Singing Competition in the Michaelmas Term, in which all Houses compete with both a unison and part-song component.

We have pupil organists at various levels, who work towards playing hymns for Chapel Services. The organ at Stowe is the second largest school chapel organ in the world, with four manuals and seventy-five stops. It is serviced and tuned regularly by Harrison's of Durham with an ongoing maintenance programme in place.





There is a Chapel Choir, currently consisting of around seventy pupils, who sing in the weekly Eucharist or Evensong services. They sing a wide range of repertoire mostly drawn from the Anglican choral tradition. They also sing a cappella and accompanied secular repertoire at various School and local events. Our two Pop Choirs perform throughout the year, including the annual Musical Theatre evening and as part of our Ensembles Concert.

The School currently has thirty-two Music Award Holders (either Scholars or Exhibitioners) who play a significant role by contributing to music at Stowe. Of these, most are working above, at or around Grade VIII level. The Music Department is outstanding in many respects, and most staff members are active professional musicians both locally and nationally with some high-profile organisations.

The Department works closely with the Drama Department to produce music theatre productions and music for plays. The School premièred the UK Schools Version of Prodigy in 2019, originally commissioned by the National Youth Music Theatre, with whom we have close links. In recent years the School has also put on very successful productions which involved pupils from our prep schools in supporting roles. In the Summer Term, ensembles and soloists perform for guests at Speech Day. There is also a large pop concert produced annually in the Summer Term, attended by most of the School. Featured guest artists for this concert have included Roger Hodgson (Supertramp), Tony Hadley (Spandau Ballet) and in 2022 we welcomed Tom Walker and Lulu.

We offer masterclasses in wind, brass, string, percussion, voice and keyboard. There are also numerous Prep School and community outreach days. Pupils regularly participate in local and national competitions, including the local Milton Keynes Festival of Music and Drama, and the South East Schools Chamber Music Competition. We have excellent ABRSM and Trinity exam board results.





Academic **Music**

In the Third Form (Year 9), pupils receive one period (55 minutes) of Music each week; thereafter academic Music is available at GCSE, AS and A Level. The numbers taking GCSE and A Level Music are in line with or exceeding the national average and results are strong. Pupils follow the Eduqas syllabi for GCSE, AS and A Level Music and Edexcel for Music Technology.

The inclusive nature of the Edugas course, especially at GCSE, ensures that pupils of all musical genres including popular music, DJing and sequencing are able to access top grades.





Music Technology

Stowe boasts state-of-the-art and unrivalled facilities for Music Technology. Pupils of any age can sign up for Music Production lessons, which are treated in the same way as peripatetic instrumental lessons. Three members of staff teach around fifty pupils per week, with numbers continually increasing. We offer Music Technology at A Level and all Music Technology pupils are involved in sound engineering for School concerts and productions.



Scholarships

Stowe's Music Scholars are highly respected leaders in the School and play a vital role in its cultural life. As some of our busiest pupils, our musicians leave Stowe having learned and improved their organisational, leadership and team skills, as well as having developed their musical skill.

We are an All-Steinway School and are lucky to have facilities and teachers that rival many music colleges and universities. A number of awards are made each year, ranging from Exhibitions (free instrumental tuition on one or two instruments) to Scholarships (a Scholarship plus free instrumental tuition on two instruments).

A candidate's musicianship and practice ethic will have a direct bearing on any award granted, and successful candidates will be expected to play a full and active role in the Department, including membership of our choirs. We accommodate additional practice time for award holders, with the flexibility to attend Junior Academy or the Royal College on Saturdays. Music Scholars are expected to study GCSE Music.

An early informal meeting with the Director of Music is highly recommended before you make



an application. We recommend organising free consultation lessons in advance of an application.

To apply, parents should obtain references from the candidate's Head, Director of Music and their instrumental teachers. As an approximate guide, a Lower School Music Scholar (Year 9 entry) should have a merit or distinction at Grade 5 on at least one instrument and Senior School Scholars (Year 12 entry) should be Grade 8 standard on their first study instrument.



From composing music for film and television, orchestrating pop songs to performing concerti and giving solo recitals, Ben has established himself as a versatile musician across a variety of genres and mediums.

Ben is an author for Hal Leonard and he has written a number of publications which have been published worldwide. His arrangement of 'Hatikvah' is currently featured on the ABRSM grade 8 violin and Trinity grade 7 syllabus. He has given numerous performances both in the UK, Eastern Europe and East Asia at venues including St Martin in the Fields in London, The Pump Room in Bath, Óbudai Társaskör, Budapest, and the City Hall in Hong Kong. Ben also has an extensive concerto repertoire and notable performances include Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue, Rachmaninov's 2nd and 3rd Piano Concertos. He recently gave a performance of Beethoven's 4th piano concerto with the Alina orchestra in the Chapel at Stowe.

Jonathan Kingston was an organ student at Liverpool Cathedral before being appointed Sub Organist at Bradford Cathedral. Assistant Director and Director of Music appointments followed at two leading HMC schools, before an appointment to The King's School, Ely as Director of Music where he also served Ely Cathedral as Deputy Organist and as a Choral Director. Jonathan is a recording artist for Naxos, Priory and EMI Records and is an ABRSM grade and diploma examiner, trainer, and professional reviewer, touring this country and internationally. He has appeared with many leading orchestras and choirs including the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic, Hallé, London Symphony Orchestra & Chorus and English Symphony Orchestra and featured in many live broadcasts for BBC radio and television. He is a trustee for the National Musicians' Church in London and is a Freeman of the City of London. Jonathan directs the Banbury Choral Society and is Director of Music at the Parish Church in Stony Stratford.

Jonathan's part-time role at Stowe sees him co-ordinate the direction of the choirs, Choral Society and vocal groups while also overseeing the provision of performing opportunities for vocalists in conjunction with the highly dedicated and supportive singing professionals, who form the singing faculty.



With over 20 years' experience in recording and music production, Ben has credits with artists such as Gabrielle Aplin, JP Cooper, Dylan and Myles Sanko.

As a performer Ben has appeared at events such as the British Formula One GP, the FA Cup Final at Wembley Stadium, and has shared a stage with Damon Albarn (blur/Gorillaz), Rick Wakeman (Yes) and the late Bernie Marsden (Whitesnake). As an avid guitarist, singer and songwriter, Ben also heads up our School record label, bringing valuable experience to Stoics who choose to go on to follow a career in the music industry.

In 2018, Ben helped to propel Old Stoic 'Dylan' onto the world stage - she has recently toured the UK with Bastille and worldwide with Fd Sheeran.
