


Senior Congreve 2022 is the musical Grease written in 1971 by Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey

Directed by Rebecca Clark, the Stowe Drama Department is working in collaboration with the Music and Art Departments to stage this hit musical. Chosen in early 2022, the production has gained a poignancy since the recent death of Olivia Newton-John, who starred as Sandy in the 1978 film of the same name.

Rebecca Clark - Director's Note

Always fascinated by the origins of theatre, I was gripped when I discovered the play's origins to be a semi-autobiographical account, based on Jim Jacob's own adolescence at Taft High School, Chicago, where it was originally staged.

Named after the 1950s working class youth



My instinct on my first reading of the script was that Grease is the story of a group of working-class, mostly immigrant, teenagers who struggle to find acceptance and fulfilment. Excluded from the mainstream territory of school councils, cheer squads and sports teams that are firmly occupied by the wealthier, middle-class kids, the Burger Palace Boys and the Pink Ladies are those failed by the system. Tackling teenage pregnancy, gang violence and peer pressure alongside discrimination on the grounds of class and race, Jacob's young characters display a heart-warming resilience and humour that is immediately compelling. Learning that the show's messages were diluted, leading to the play becoming somewhat saccharine affirmed my view that this was the right play for the right time, and formulated the vision for our production.

The set design concept is driven by the idea of finding an environment where the new 'teenager' would hang out in 1950s America; a secret hideaway behind the school which would allow for a grittier, counter-culture setting, stylistically a distance away from the saccharine stereotype so entrenched in minds by the iconic 1978 Randal Keizer's film adaptation. The costumes are designed to capture an America where for the first time, there was a fashion for kids, whilst also taking into consideration the social demographic of these young people whose disposable income was negligible, so their clothes seem outgrown, and they are a little unkempt.



Colonel Andrew Croft, DSO, OBE (Chandos 25) was an extraordinary man and we are justifiably proud of him as our first Head Boy. He became a mountaineer and Arctic explorer in the 1930s who served with distinction during World War II, mainly behind enemy lines, in Finland, Norway and France. He joined the Special Operations Executive in 1942 and ran major operations from Corsica in 1943-44. In the Summer of 1944, his team parachuted into Southern France to assist the French Resistance in expelling the Germans from the area around, and including, Montpelier, exploits for which he received the Distinguished Service Order.

Later in life, he was active in reforming various army training schools as well as helping to organise the successful 1953 Mount Everest expedition and ended his career of service as first Commandant of the Metropolitan Police Cadet College, for which he received an OBE upon his retirement in 1971.

It is Andrew Croft's extraordinary achievements as a Polar explorer, for which he was awarded the Polar Medal in 1943, on which we focus in an exhibition to be held in the Watson Art Gallery. A wonderful and fascinating collection of photographs, clothing and original equipment from, amongst other expeditions his pioneering 1934 British Trans-Greenland Expedition, will be on display.



CENTENARY DAY

Thursday 11 May 2023

It was on Friday 11 May 1923 that, on the North Front steps, JF Roxburgh welcomed the first 99 boys to Stowe, proclaiming the opening of a school that would transform the educational landscape of the country.

Exactly a century later, Stowe is fully co-educational and our Centenary Day will be an occasion for all 900 current Stoics, joined by the School community of teachers and all our non-teaching Staff, to reflect upon and mark the School's first 100 years.

We will take the opportunity to re-open formally the restored 'Mr Roxburgh's Garden'.

The programme for the day will include: a Centenary Day Service in Chapel, led by The Rt Revd Ric Thorpe (Walpole 83), Bishop of Islington, the formal re-opening of Mr Roxburgh's Garden with invited quests, lunch for our invited quests in the State Music Room and Centenary Day Activities on the North Front for Stoics and Staff and our quests.



MR ROXBURGH'S **GARDEN**

from Friday 12 May 2023

This year, we are delighted to reinstate JF Roxburgh's garden on the South Front to commemorate the School's Centenary.

The garden was commissioned in 1922 by Roxburgh and formed the Eastern side of the South Front parterre. It was one of the earliest design works by Brenda Colvin who went on to be a respected Landscape architect who founded the Landscape Institute (the professional body for Landscape Architects). Her projects include the gardens at The University of Wales, Aberystwyth which are now listed as they are considered to be of historical significance.


The garden has hosted both Queen Mary and HRH Prince George (later King George VI).




An approach was made to Colvin and Moggridge, the company founded by Brenda Colvin in 1922, and they are delighted to be involved with this project as it aligns with their own Centenary this year. Colvin and Moggridge devised the landscape masterplan for the new National Trust Visitors' Centre at New Inn and have an extensive portfolio which includes Petworth Park, Leeds Castle and Blenheim Palace.



Only 23 years ago, the Stowe House Preservation Trust embarked on one of the most ambitious and challenging country house restorations ever undertaken - and, with it, the renaissance of what has been described as "the largest and most completely realised private neo-classical buildings in the world."

Starting with essential work to safeguard the fabric of the building, the Trust has moved progressively through the interiors, researching historical schemes, negotiating funding and managing risks, including a global pandemic to deliver a restoration of awardwinning quality.

Some said it could not be done but, as the School Centenary approaches, it is nearing completion. In all, nearly £30m has been spent on the programme so far and we hope that all members of the Stowe community - current and Old Stoics, their Parents, Staff and Friends of Stowe - will agree that it was worth every penny.

None of this would have been possible without the support of donors too numerous to mention but whose generosity has been greatly appreciated.

THE ANTHONY EYTON COLLECTION

As our Centenary celebrations approached, in 2017 we were delighted and honoured to commission one of Britain's finest painters, Anthony Eyton, to record Stowe in all seasons and in all its glorious guises.

Working with Mark Flawn-Thomas (Grenville 72), the two artists have captured and conveyed the vitality of the landscape and the people who live and work in this extraordinary environment. Their work at Stowe over the past five years has captured not only the beauty and magnificence of the architecture and grounds but importantly it records too the activities of the School itself.

Anthony Eyton RA studied fine art at Reading University in 1941 before serving in the Army from 1942 to 1947. He went on to study at Camberwell School of Art from 1947 to 1950 and in 1951 received an Abbey Major Scholarship taking him to work in Italy. Anthony taught at the Royal Academy Schools from 1964 to 1999.

Mark Flawn-Thomas is an amateur artist and friend of Anthony who introduced him to Stowe.

We are very grateful to the group of Old Stoics whose generosity has made possible the acquisition of this important body of work for permanent exhibition in the Music School at Stowe.

The exhibition, Arcadia Revisited, will be available to view on Speech Day at Stowe. Following this, the School is pleased to invite Old Stoics, Parents and Friends to a private view of Arcadia Revisited at the Cello Factory in Lambeth on Monday 26 June from 7pm to 9pm.






